SUGGESTED INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS COLONIAL SHUTTERS

- 1. Identify the panels with the openings.
 - a. For example: You will have four panels for a Bi-fold (2 Left & 2 Right).
- Lay the panels on a smooth surface with the back (jack nuts side is the backside) facing up. Note: For Bi-fold, position the two corresponding panels together.
- 3. Line in hinge pins to secure Bi-folds together if installing a Bi-fold shutter.
- 4. Install the Z bars at top and bottom of all jams where panels meet using 1" screws.
 - a. For a 2 panel shutter there will be 2 Z bars to install.
 - b. For a Bi-fold shutter (4 panels) there will be 6 Z bars to install.
- 5. Install the 2 Flutter bars where the left and right panels of opening meet using 1" screws.
- 6. If shutter overall height is greater than 72 inches install lock bar (2" x 5" tube) at middle of shutter height. The mounting angles mount to top and bottom of lock bar on each end using 3 2 ½" bolts with nuts. The lock bar is mounted to the shutters using 6" bolts.
- 7. For single panel shutters (1 left & 1 right) attach B-hinges (1 ½") to the panels, to allow you to attach the shutters to the wall
- 8. For Bi-fold shutters (2 left & 2right) attach C-hinges (2") to the panels, to allow you to attach the shutters to the wall
- 9. Go to the window opening, find the center and mark
- 10. Pick up the unit and place on the window. Ensure it is centered.
- 11. Note: If window sill is present place a ¼ "shim on the window sill
- 12. Make sure it is plumb, level and square.
- 13. Anchor the upper most left hinge to the wall
- 14. Check the plumb and level again
- 15. Attach the rest of the Hinges
- 16. Mark and drill the holes for the locking bar's fasteners
- 17. Remove the Z bar, flutter and locking bars,
- 18. Attach bullet clip to shutters and fold back shutters to the wall with bullet in clip.
- 19. Mark walls and drill hole for bullets.
- 20. Wipe down the panels with clean wet cloth and mild liquid soap.
